
National Sea Grant College Program



Educating the next generation of marine and coastal scientist and policy markers.



CA Sea Grant State Fellowships

- * Modeled after the Knauss Fellowship Program
- * Provides a one-year fellowship in a California state or federal agency to learn about implementation of marine policy and management in CA
- * Recently finished MS, PhD or JD students in marine or aquatic-related field at CA universities are eligible
- * Supported 118 State Fellows since program inception in 1988

State Fellowship Schedule Class 2016

- * June 2015: Call for fellowship hosts
- * July 2015: Host applications due
- * August 2015: Hosts confirmed; call for fellowship applicants
- * September 24 2015: Applications due
- * **Sept October 2015:** CASG interviews eligible, mostqualified candidates to select finalists (Skype, in-person or phone); finalists' applications distributed to participating hosts
- * November 16 -17: Matching workshop with hosts and finalists in Sacramento, CA
- * January March 2016: Start of fellowship (start date may be negotiated between Fellow and Host)

State Fellowship Award (2016)

- * CASG administers \$47,700 per State Fellow
 - * \$43,200 for stipend and living expenses
 - * \$2,500 to cover health insurance reimbursement (fellow must be named and the payer on policy)
 - * \$2,000 to cover travel
 - * Matching workshop related expenses
 - * Fellowship related activities (meetings, workshops, symposia, SG Extension meeting)
 - * At its discretion a host agency can add to this amount

Application


- * Curriculum Vitae (2 pages max)
- * A personal education and career goal statement (1000 words max)
- * Two letters of recommendation
- * Copy of undergraduate and graduate student transcripts. Unofficial copies will be accepted.

Eligibility

* Graduate students at a California university close to completing their degree, or recently graduated (graduation date after May 1, 2014)

Fellows must complete all degree requirements before starting the fellowship (if you won't be finished before April 2016 apply next year)

State Fellowship Selection

- * Selection criteria include:
 - * academic ability,
 - * communication skills,
 - * diversity and appropriateness of academic background,
 - * additional qualifying experience, and
 - * support of referees.
- * Fellowship assignments based on interviews and ranking of preferences by both the finalists and participating hosts at a mandatory matching workshop (in Sacramento, November 16-17, 2015). Finalists <u>must</u> attend
- * Placement to a specific host cannot be guaranteed

Tips for application preparation (1)

View the application package as pieces of a **jigsaw puzzle** that reflect the best and complete picture of who you are. In most cases, the electronic application, and not the interview with Sea Grant, will determine if you will be selected as a member of the fellowship class. So every piece of the puzzle counts!

Tips for application preparation (2)

* Curriculum Vitae

- * Diversity of activities, classes, extracurricular awards, and volunteer activities are good to show
- * Consider including relevant experiences, even if they are not in marine science or policy; especially if the experience demonstrates leadership, project management, communication or people skills
- * Do not list all relevant coursework (the transcripts will reflect all courses)
- * Types of publications and presentations
- * <u>Do not exceed TWO pages</u> using 12 pt. font with 1 inch margins; choose your words and items carefully

Tips for application preparation (3)

- * A personal education and career goal statement (1000 words or less)
 - * Addressing how your past experiences relate to the Fellowship is important, but also address how, as a result of this experience, your career could be enhanced
 - * Do not narrate your CV, use this piece to highlight or describe something in the CV more in depth or something else all together
 - * The statement demonstrates your writing skill, thought process, your interests and passions, and most importantly, why you want to become a State Fellow

Tips for Application preparation (4)

- * Two letters of recommendation
 - * The strength and quality of the letter are more important than who wrote it
 - * Make sure to ask the people who know you best and think highly of you
 - * Template letters with name, course title, and grade will pretty much ensure that you will not be selected as one of the finalists
 - * Letter from your advisor the emphasis should be on you, and not solely about your thesis project
 - * To preserve confidentiality, letters of recommendations should be sent directly to our office. Letters can sent as attachments in emails to sgfellow@ucsd.edu or faxed to our office at 858-534-2231.
- * Copy of undergraduate and graduate student transcripts (unofficial is OK)

Selection considerations

- * Was the Goal Statement specific, direct, and concise while discussing what the applicant would bring to and gain from the Fellowship?
- * Was a career or life goal stated?
- * Did the applicant have volunteer and extracurricular activities?
- * Did the recommendation letters demonstrate knowledge of the applicant and his/her abilities? Did they know the applicant more than as a participant in a class? Was the 2nd letter from a diverse activity (not from 2 professors working in one lab)?
- * Did the applicant have a diverse background including a diversity of classes (balanced and appropriate coursework)?
- * What was the strength of the academic achievement?
- * How much marine and aquatic science and /or policy experience did the applicant have?
- * Was the publication or presentation record relevant to the applicant's career stage?
- * Were acronyms defined?
- * Were there misspelled words and/or grammatical errors?
