

Swordfish has long been a culinary star. Its Firm flesh can stand up to preparations that flakier, more delicate fish could never handle — thrown atop a grill as a steak, for example, Bu in Culifornia, the fishery is not without controversy. 



Application Tips and Tricks



What Our Reviewers Are Looking For (1)

Was the Goal Statement specific, direct, and concise while discussing what the applicant would bring to and gain from the Fellowship?

Was a career or life goal stated?

Did the applicant describe volunteer and/or extracurricular activities?

Did the applicant provide insight into their diverse background including balanced and appropriate coursework?



What Our Reviewers Are Looking For (2)

How has academic achievement been balanced with professional goals?

How did the applicant describe their marine and coastal science and/or policy experience?

Are the experiences and skills described clear and transferable to the State Fellowship?

Did the recommendation letters demonstrate knowledge of the applicant and their abilities?



Inside a Reviewers Mind



Assignment

Review fellowship proposals using pre-assigned evaluation criteria

Challenges

Personal experiences and biases Work & life (time) Reviewer fatigue

Tip 1 Don't assume; explain/write for a scientifically educated reader

Tip 2

Be explicit; directly address how you will benefit from the state fellowship and what you will bring


Tip 3

Use space wisely; tackle weaknesses and how they will be addressed
