About the Program

Located in Windsor, Sonoma County, we monitor native salmon and steelhead at all life stages and work closely with partners to support salmonid recovery efforts throughout the Russian River basin. Summer field work includes electrofishing, habitat assessments, snorkeling, water quality and streamflow monitoring, and operating PIT-tag detection equipment.

Qualifications and Requirements

Interns will work directly with biologists to collect scientific data in the field. Applicants should be interested in fish monitoring, natural resource management, or a related field. Interns are required to hike long distances in the stream channel while carrying survey equipment. Position runs late-June through mid-August and a minimum of 2 full workdays per week is required. Internship is non-compensated, but college credit is available.
